



### **Transport volumes 1969 - 2008**





- Turkey has an advantageous position between Europe and Asia, giving it an important transit function.






### **ECONOMIC RELATIONS**

### RISC FACTORS FOR RAIL FREIGHT SOLUTIONS



- Compared to EU standard, Turkey's railway infrastructure is not much developed.
  - Only about 20 % of the rail lines are electrified.
  - Only about 24 % of railway infrastructure are provided with signalling systems.
- About 95 % of national goods transports are done by road.
- Turkey's international goods transports are mainly done by sea.
- The rail system has been neglected in the past.
- Only a few big distribution centres and modern multimodal terminals with networking between rail, road and air freight
- Using rail solutions between Western Europe and Turkey: numerous countries with different technical conditions (power supply, signalling systems, profiles)




- Munich Ljubljana Halkali (Istanbul) v.v.

Transport volumes in consignments March – Aug. 2009 / March – Aug. 2008: + 28 %






### **ROUTING VIA TRIEST E**

- New start of service is planned in November






### MANNHEIM - TRIESTE v.v.

## **Company Profile**

- Main business: intermodal transport services in the corridor between Turkey and EU states
- Target group: freight forwarders and carriers

  - Expansion of rail network connections in the Asian part of Turkey

### **CREAM-PROJEKT**



CREAM (Customer-driven Rail-freight services on a European mega-corridor based on Advanced business and operating Models")

- 30 project partners from 14 countries (railway undertakings, operators in combined transport, research institutions, technology providers)
- Project term: 1 January 2007 31 December 2009
- Main target is to improve rail freight services and gain competitiveness on the corridor between Western Europe and Turkey/Greece:
  - Shorten of transport time
  - Growth on rail freight transport volume
  - Creation of coherent Quality Management Systems to get equal conditions of transport and similar production quality on the whole corridor
  - Utilization of harmonized IT and Telematic systems
  - Knowledge transfer
